

Purgatory Chasm

On Friday, June 26th, Camp Stow will be going on a field trip to Purgatory Chasm (198 Purgatory Rd, Sutton, MA 01590)! On this trip, campers will split into groups and explore the nature and wildlife trails, accompanied by the counselors to remain within proper ratios. Please send your child a snack, lunch, water bottle, and appropriate clothing. A waiver will be sent out prior to the trip and will need to be completed in order to attend. We will be planning on departing from Pine Bluffs Recreational Area at approximately 10am and returning by approximately 3pm.

In case of emergency, the following procedures will be followed:

- **Lost Camper** — Upon notification of a missing camper, the camp director will get a detailed description and give it to the counselors on the trip. All campers and CITs must report back to their counselor so that a head count can be taken. Once all campers and CITs have been accounted for the counselor will report that to the Camp Director. If the lost camper is not found, then counselors will follow procedure for a missing camper and the Camp Director will call 911.
- **Injuries/Illness** — Once an emergency is assessed, 911 is dialed and the victim is transported in the emergency vehicle to the nearest hospital or the hospital requested by the child's adult family members on the Authorization and Consent Form. A staff member rides with the child, taking along the child's records. The Camp Director will notify the parents/guardians and keep them updated throughout the situation.
- **Fire/Natural Disasters** — 911 will be dialed. Instructors, Head Counselors, Assistant Counselors will have campers and CITs exit the trails quietly and calmly. They will lead the groups to the entrance by the buses where they will take attendance and listen for further instructions. If this area is unavailable, an alternative location that is safe and sheltered will be communicated by the Camp Director.
- **Active Shooter** — In the event of an active shooter emergency, the camp will immediately implement its emergency response procedures to protect all campers, CITs, and staff. The Camp Director will call 911 and trained staff will guide campers and CITs to either evacuate the area to a pre-designated safe location, in this case the area of the buses, or move them into secure lockdown areas, depending on the situation. During this time, all efforts will be focused on keeping the kids calm, quiet, and out of harm's way while emergency services are contacted. We will be planning on departing from Pine Bluffs Recreational Area at approximately 10am and returning by approximately 3pm.
